## NOTES

---

**Brett L. Wery's** *Sonata for multiple woodwinds and piano* is one of the few pieces written to feature a woodwind “doubler,” a player of multiple woodwind instruments. Wery describes the piece as “a sonata for multiple woodwinds that is not a novelty piece but provides the doubler with an opportunity to perform a serious work that explores the expressive and technical boundaries of their instrument(s). By the same token, the pianist is not an accompanist but an equal partner with the doubler.”

**Carl Nielsen** said of his *Fantasy Pieces*: “The two oboe pieces are a very early opus. The first – slow – piece gives the oboe the opportunity to sing out its notes quite as beautifully as this instrument can. The second is more humorous, roguish, with an undertone of Nordic nature and forest in the moonlight.”

**Émile Paladilhe** was one of many composers to write oboe works for the Paris Conservatoire’s annual “Concours,” a public performance jury and competition for the conservatory’s students. This piece was performed by oboe students in 1898 and several subsequent years.

**André Previn**’s remarkable career includes performing and recording as both a classical and a jazz pianist, conducting several major American and European orchestras, and composing for the concert stage and for film. He has won four Academy Awards for his film music and ten Grammy awards for his recordings.
